Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone Financial Statements of ABV Alcohols Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31st, 2024, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year ended on that date, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the Financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone Financial Statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended ("AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31st, 2024, its Loss for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the standalone Financial Statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act (SAs). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the Financial Statements.

Information Other than the Standalone Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report and Annual Return, but does not include the standalone financial statements and our auditors' report thereon.

Our opinion on the standalone financial statements does not cover the Board Report and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the standalone financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the standalone financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement in this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Management's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these standalone Financial Statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance of the Company in accordance with the AS and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Financial Statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the Financial Statements.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

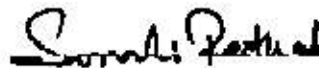

Notes on the Standalone Financial Statements for the year ended March 31, 2024

NOTE: 1

CORPORATE INFORMATION

ABV ALCOHOLS PRIVATE LIMITED ('the Company'), is a Private limited company, incorporated and incorporated under law relating to Companies in India, the Company was registered on 24th October, 1997. The registered office is located at 15, Pusa Road, New Delhi – 110 005

NOTE: 2

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1. Basis of accounting and preparation of Standalone Financial Statements

(a) Compliance with Accounting Standards

These standalone financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply in all material respect with the Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. The accounting policies adopted in preparation of these standalone financial statements are consistent with those applied in the previous year.

Small and Medium Sized Company (SMC) - The Company is a Small and Medium Sized Company (SMC) as defined in the General Instructions in respect of Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended). Accordingly, the Company has complied with the Accounting Standards as applicable to a Small and Medium Sized Company.

(b) Historical Cost Convention

These standalone financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on a going concern and on accrual basis.

(c) Current versus non-current classification

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current, wherever applicable as per the operating cycle of the Company and guidance as set out in Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. The company has ascertained its operating cycle as one year for the purpose of current and non-current classification of assets and liabilities, the period of one year being reckoned from the reporting date.

1.2. Use of Estimates

The preparation of the standalone financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions considered in reporting of amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the standalone financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual results could differ from those estimates and adjustments, if any, due to the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognized in future in the reporting periods in which the results are known / materialized.

1.3. Property, Plant and Equipment

Freehold land is carried at cost. All other items of property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. The cost of an asset comprises of purchase price and cost directly attributable to bringing the assets to its present condition for intended use. Additional cost arising out of the increase liability on account of fluctuations in foreign currency relating to import of assets or any borrowing cost incurred with relation to the asset is added to the cost of assets.

Machinery spares which can be used only in connection with an item of fixed asset and whose use is expected to be irregular are capitalized and depreciated over the useful life of the principal item of the relevant assets. Fixed assets acquired and put to use for project purposes are capitalized and depreciated in the project cost till commissioning of the project.

Fixed assets acquired in full or part exchange for another asset are recorded at the fair market value or the net book value of the asset given up, adjusted for any balancing cash consideration. Fair market value is determined either for the assets acquired or asset given up, whichever is more clearly evident.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognized as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of any component accounted for as a separate asset is derecognized when replaced. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss during the reporting period in which they are incurred.

Fixed assets retired from active use and held for sale are stated at the lower of their net book value and net realizable value and are disclosed separately in the Balance Sheet.

Profit or loss on disposal/ scrapping/ write off/ retirement from active use of tangible assets are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Capital Work in Progress: Property, plant and equipment which are not ready for their intended use are disclosed under capital work-in-progress. Expenditure during construction period (including borrowing cost relating to borrowed funds for construction or acquisition of property, plant and equipment) incurred on projects/ assets, including trial run expenses (net of revenue) are treated as pre-operative expenses, pending allocation to the assets, and are included under capital work-in-progress. These expenses are apportioned to related property, plant and equipment on commencement of commercial production.

1.4. Intangible Assets

Intangible Assets are stated at cost of acquisition, net of recoverable taxes, trade discount and rebates less accumulated amortization / depletion and impairment losses, if any. Such cost includes purchase price, borrowing costs and any cost directly attributable to bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use, net charges on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the Intangible Assets.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognized as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the entity and the cost can be measured reliably.

Gains or losses arising from de-recognition of an Intangible Asset are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognized in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss when the asset is derecognized.

1.5. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized only when it can be reliably measured and it is recoverable to the extent of ultimate collection as recommended by AS-9 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

The specific criterion for recognition of revenue from each of the Company's activities is stated below:

- (a) **Sale of Goods:** As recommended by AS-9 issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India on Revenue Recognition' Revenue from sale of goods is recognized when:

- the significant risks and rewards of ownership transferred to the buyer;
 - there is no continuing effective control or managerial involvement with the goods;
 - the associated cost can be estimated reliably;
 - the amount of revenue can be measured reliably and
 - recovery of the consideration is probable.
- Sales are stated at net of GST, Trade discounts and return's, if any.

- (b) **Income from Services**

Revenues from contracts priced on a time and material basis are recognized when services are rendered and related costs are incurred.

Revenue from turnkey contracts, which are generally time bound fixed price contracts, are recognized over the life of the contract using the proportionate completion method, with contract costs, determining the degree of completion. Foreseeable losses on such contracts are recognized when probable.

Revenue from maintenance contracts are recognized pro-rata over the period of contract.

- (c) **Other income -Interest income:** Interest income is recognized on time proportion accrual basis using the applicable / effective interest rate.

1.6. Depreciation/ Amortization

Depreciation on tangible fixed assets and amortization of intangible fixed assets is provided on WDV method at the rates in accordance with the useful lives of the assets prescribed under Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. The rates and methods of depreciation are also in line with the estimated useful lives, as determined by the management. The residual value of the assets is estimated to be 5% of the cost of assets.

Depreciation is calculated on prorata basis for assets purchased / sold during the year. The appropriateness of useful life of assets and depreciation method is reviewed by the management each financial year.

1.7. Investments

Non-current investments (excluding investment properties) are carried individually at cost less provision for diminution, other than temporary in the value of such investments. Current investments are carried individually, at the lower of cost or fair value. Cost of investments includes acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties.

Investment properties are carried individually at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any. Investment properties are capitalized and depreciated (where applicable) in accordance with the policy stated for tangible fixed assets. Impairment of investment property is determined in accordance with the policy stated for impairment of assets.

1.8. Taxes on Income

Income Tax

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Current income tax asset and liabilities are measured at the amount expected to be recovered from or paid to the taxation authorities. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantially enacted, at the reporting time.

Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT)

MAT paid in accordance with the tax laws, which gives future economic benefits in the form of adjustment to the future income tax liability, is considered as an asset if there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period. Accordingly, MAT is recognized as an asset in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefit associated with it will flow to the Company. Such asset is reviewed at each balance sheet date and the carrying amount of the MAT credit asset is written down to the extent there is no longer a convincing evidence to the effect that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period.

Deferred Income Tax

As per Accounting Standard 22 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, Deferred tax liability/assets is recognized subject to prudence, on timing differences, being difference between taxable and Accounting income/ Expenditure that originate in one period and capable of being reversal in one or more subsequent period.

Deferred income tax is provided in full, using the liabilities method on temporary differences between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amount in the financial statements. Deferred income tax is determined using tax rates (and laws) that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the end of reporting period and are expected to apply when the related deferred income tax asset are realized or the deferred income tax liabilities are settled.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent when there is reasonable certainty that the assets can be realized in future. However, where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward of losses, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is a virtual certainty of realization of such assets.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relates to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set-off and intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realize the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Current and deferred tax is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognized in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, respectively.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets, if recognized, is reviewed at each reporting date and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow all or part of the deferred tax asset to be utilized. Unrecognized deferred tax assets are re-assessed at each reporting date and are recognized to the extent that it has become probable that future taxable profits will allow the deferred tax assets to be recovered.

1.9. Earning per share

The earning considered in ascertaining the Company's Earning per Share (EPS) comprises the net profit after tax as per "Accounting Standard 20 – Earning per Share" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

Basic earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to the equity shareholders of the Company by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

Diluted earnings per share

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders of the Company and weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period, are adjusted for the effect of all potentially dilutive equity shares.

1.10. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions are recognized when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation and the amount can be reliably estimated. Provisions are not recognized for future operating losses.

Provisions are measured at the present value of management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the end of the reporting period. The discount rate used to determine the present value is a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and risks specific to the liability.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed in respect of possible obligations that arise from past events but their existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company or where any present obligation cannot be measured in terms of future outflow of resources or where a reliable estimate of the obligation cannot be made.

After considering the facts and legal aspects of each claim against the Company, either provisions are made or the same are disclosed as contingent liabilities. The Company does not recognize a contingent Liability but disclose its existence in the financial statements (notes) wherever required.

Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the standalone financial statements. Provisions and contingent liabilities are reviewed at each balance sheet date.

1.11. Employees Benefits

Employee benefits include provident fund, superannuation fund, gratuity fund, compensated absences, long service awards and post-employment medical benefits.

(i) Short term obligations

The undiscounted amount of short term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange of service rendered by the employee is recognized in the year when the employee actually render service.

(ii) Post-employment benefits

No post-employment benefits are payable to any employee as per terms of employment or pursuant to statutory provisions to the extent applicable to the Company.

1.12. Impairment of Assets

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units are reviewed at each reporting date to determine if there is indication of any impairment. If any indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognized whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognized in the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss.

An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount. An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined net of depreciation, if no impairment loss had been recognized. The assets that suffered impairment are reviewed for possible reversal of impairment at the end of each reporting period.

1.13. Accounting for Investment in Associates

The consolidated financial statements when prepared shall include the share of profit / (loss) of the Associate company accounted as per the 'Equity method'. The share of profit / (loss) of the Associate company (the loss being restricted to the cost of investment) shall be added to / deducted from the cost of investments. An Associate is an enterprise in which the Company has significant influence and which is neither a subsidiary nor a joint venture of the investor.

1.14. Debtors

Debtors are stated in the balance sheet at estimated net realisable value. Net realisable value is the invoiced amount less provisions for bad and doubtful debtors. Provisions are made specifically against debtors where there is evidence of a dispute or an inability to pay. An additional provision is made based on an analysis of balances by age, previous losses experienced and general economic conditions.

1.15. Inventories

Finished goods, Work-in-Progress and Stock-in-trade are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. Raw material, Packing Materials, consumables and Goods in transit are valued at cost. Wastes and Scraps are valued at net realizable value.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less essential cost of application of completion and the estimated cost necessary to make the sale.

Cost comprises all cost of purchase, cost of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. Cost is ascertained on the basis of FIFO method.

1.16. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short term balances (with an original maturities of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amount of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

1.17. Cash Flow Statement

Cash flows are reported using the Indirect method, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

1.18. Related Parties

The following shall be related parties and any transaction with them shall be disclosed separately:

- (a) enterprises that directly, or indirectly through one or more intermediaries, control, or are controlled by, or are under common control with, the reporting enterprise (this includes holding companies, subsidiaries and fellow subsidiaries);
- (b) associates and joint ventures of the reporting enterprise and the investing party or venturer in respect of which the reporting enterprise is an associate or a joint venture;
- (c) individuals owning, directly or indirectly, an interest in the voting power of the reporting enterprise that gives them control or significant influence over the enterprise, and relatives of any such individual;
- (d) key management personnel and relatives of such personnel; and
- (e) Enterprises over which any person described in (c) or (d) is able to exercise significant influence. This includes enterprises owned by directors or major shareholders of the reporting enterprise and enterprises that have a member of key management in common with the reporting enterprise.

1.19. Significant Events

Events occurring after the balance sheet date are those significant events, both favourable and unfavourable, that occur between the balance sheet date and the date on which the standalone financial statements are approved by the Board of Directors in the case of a company, and, by the corresponding approving authority in the case of any other entity. Two types of events are identified wherever they occur:

- (a) Those which provide further evidence of conditions that existed at the balance sheet date; and
- (b) Those which are indicative of conditions that arose subsequent to the balance sheet date.

1.20. Borrowing cost

Borrowing costs include interest, ancillary costs incurred in connection with the borrowings and exchange differences arising from foreign currency borrowings to the extent they are regarded as an adjustment to the interest cost.

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use.

Borrowing costs in connection with the borrowing of funds are capitalized up-to the date when such qualifying assets are ready for its intended use, in accordance with the Accounting Standard 16 on 'Borrowing Cost' issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Capitalization of borrowing costs is suspended in the period during which the active development is delayed due to, other than temporary, interruption. Interest income earned on the temporary investment of specific borrowings pending their utilization on qualifying assets is deducted from the borrowing costs eligible for capitalization.

All other borrowing costs are charged to statement of profit and loss.

1.21. Prior Period Items

Prior period items are income or expenses which arise in the current period as a result of errors or omissions in the preparation of the standalone financial statements of one or more prior periods.

Prior Period Items are recognized in books of accounts as per AS-5 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and these items are separately disclosed in the standalone Statement of Profit & Loss.

1.22. Leases

Operating Lease

Lease arrangements where the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of an asset substantially vest with the lessor are recognized as operating leases. Lease rentals under operating leases are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease unless the payments are structured to increase in line with expected general inflation to compensate for the expected inflationary cost increases.
