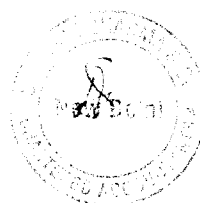

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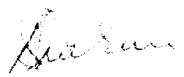

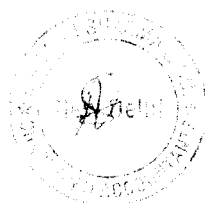
Management’s Responsibility for Internal Financial Controls

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statement

a) Method of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with the accounting standards as specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (as amended). The financial statements have been prepared on going concern basis under the historical cost convention on accrual basis in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India. All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current, wherever applicable as per the operating cycle of the Company as per the guidance as set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013.

b) Accounting Policies

Accounting policies except those specifically mentioned in the notes are consistent with those applied in the previous year.

2 Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized only when it can be reliably measured and it is recoverable to the extent of ultimate collection as recommended by AS-9 on Revenue Recognition issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

3 Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost of an asset comprises of purchase price and directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to its present condition for intended use.

4 Depreciation / Amortization

Depreciation on assets is charged as per Schedule II of Companies Act, 2013 for the relevant financial year.

5 Investments

The Company does not have any Investments.

6 Deferred Tax Assets/Liability

As per Accounting standard 22 issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, Deferred tax liability/assets is recognized subject to prudence, on timing differences, being difference between Taxable and Accounting Income/ Expenditure that originate in one period and capable of being reversal in one or more subsequent period.

Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent when there is reasonable certainty that the assets can be realized in future. However, where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward of losses, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is a virtual certainty of realization of such assets.

7 Earnings per share

The earning considered in ascertaining the Company's E P S comprises the net profit after tax as per "Accounting Standard 20 – Earning per Share" issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The number of shares used in computing basic and diluted EPS is the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period.

8 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

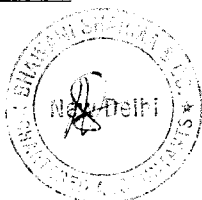
Provisions are measured using substantial degree of estimation and are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources.

b) Post employment benefits

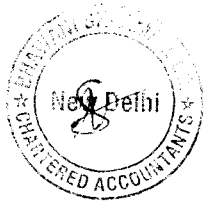
No post employment benefits are payable to any employee as per terms of employment or pursuant to statutory provisions to the extent applicable to the Company.

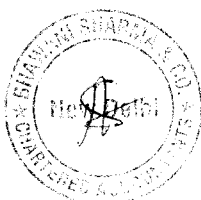
